




College Data Matches:

% enrolled in college first fall, by NSC source and program records (Grade 13)








College Enrollment Rate:

% enrolled in college first fall










College Enrollment Rate by Type of College:

% of group continuously enrolled 7th-12th grade




College Enrollment Rate, by Years in Group % Enrolled in College First Fall





College Enrollment Rate by 7th Grade GPA: % Enrolled in College First Fall




% Enrolled in Each Type of College First Fall





College Enrollment Rate, by 7th Grade Expectations: % Enrolled in Each Type of College First Fall






College Enrollment Rate, by GU Participation:
